School closures and remote learning have limited opportunities to interact with peers, exercise, access healthy meals, and optimize learning. Economic pressures have exacerbated child poverty, substandard housing, mental health, education and long-standing racial disparities.

The American Rescue Plan (ARP) (P.L. 117-2) and the proposed American Families Plan and Jobs Plan will help lift millions of children out of poverty and take critical steps to support their nutrition, housing, health, childcare and education. The ARP investments alone total over \$360 billion for kids and will go a long way toward addressing many challenges exacerbated by the

In keeping with your Executive Order, Advancing Racial Equity and Support for Underserved Communities through Federal Government,

This could be achieved through a White House Office on Children and Youth or a new Special Assistant for Children and Youth.
